

Interstate construction induction cards

This information sheet provides advice for the Victorian construction industry and interstate construction workers who may be considering working in Victoria regarding the mutual recognition of interstate Construction Induction Cards (CI Cards).

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Working in the construction industry

By law, under Part 5.1 of the Victorian Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007, a person must successfully undertake construction induction training before working at a construction site in Victoria.

Construction induction training must be provided by a registered training organisation (RTO).

A CI Card will only be issued on completion of the Construction Induction Unit of Competency, CPCCOHS1001A - 'Work safely in the construction industry'. This national training unit is included in the CPC08 - Construction, Plumbing and Services Integrated Framework Training Package.

CI Cards issued and/or recognised in Victoria

All CI Cards listed here are recognised in Victoria and all other states and territories.

All CI Cards must include:

- name
- date of birth
- signature of cardholder
- date of issue
- card registration number

CI Cards issued in ACT, NT and QLD must also include the RTO number.

Victoria

The Victorian CI Card is issued by WorkSafe Victoria and has the WorkSafe Victoria logo.



- Victorian Red Cards (pre-1 July 2008) are still recognised in Victoria.

Note: Holders of Red Cards will need to check with interstate authorities to see if they will be accepted.

Queensland

The Queensland White CI Card is issued by the Queensland Department of Employment and Industrial Relations and has the Queensland Government, Department of Employment and Industrial Relations logo.



- Queensland Blue Cards are issued by online RTOs and are also recognised in Victoria.

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Australian Capital Territory

The Australian Capital Territory CI Card is issued by the Office of Regulatory Services, Department of Justice and Community Safety and has the ACT Government logo.



Western Australia

The Western Australian CI Card is issued by WorkSafe WA and has the Western Australian Government logo.

Both versions of the Western Australian CI Cards are recognised in Victoria including those issued by online RTOs.



South Australia

The South Australia White CI Card is issued by SafeWork SA and has the SafeWork SA logo.



Tasmania

The Tasmanian White CI Card is issued by Workplace Standards Tasmania and has the Tasmanian Government logo.



New South Wales

The New South Wales CI Card is issued by WorkCover NSW and has the WorkCover NSW logo.



- NSW Green Cards are no longer valid in NSW and are not recognised in Victoria.

Northern Territory

The Northern Territory White CI Card is issued by RTO's through NT WorkSafe and has the NT Government logo.
